### Parenting Tip Be a Model!

Children learn much about the world and the way they are expected to behave towards other people simply by watching and modelling adult behaviour. This can be 'live', or through the media. It is vital that adults consider this fact as they interact with other adults in the presence of children, and that they are aware of how their actions can be interpreted, especially in an environment such as a school.

Children are great imitators, and if they observe adults attempting to solve problems through aggression, then the lesson they will learn is that aggression is the answer to problems, or indeed that it is a valid way to get your own way. On the other hand, if children observe adults successfully solving problems through negotiation, discussion and acceptance of differing viewpoints, then this can later be reflected in their own behaviour.

It's up to us to be the right models for our kids!
