

Voluntary School Contributions

about the level, structure and purpose of the voluntary school contributions at BPS. This was initially prompted by the separate request, sent last week, for various small payments including Mathletics (which had been included in the voluntary school contribution last year).

Coincidentally, at the same meeting we discussed the MySchool website, in particular the school financial data that is now shown there. It includes a 'cost per student' figure for all expenses (including salaries, maintenance, district office and state office support, and parent contributions). Our figure is about \$7400 per child, which is very low compared to many other schools. This is simply a result of our circumstances- we are neither a disadvantaged community attracting extra funding, nor are we a rich community receiving high fees and donations. Despite this, our results are excellent- far superior to other schools receiving in some cases in excess of \$20 000 per student. This strongly reinforces the view that public schools such as ours deliver outstanding results with minimal resources. Nonetheless, we have to work very hard to make sure we do have the resources in the school to meet our students' needs.

I know at times it seems that, as it was expressed to me recently, I always have my hand in your pocket! Obviously I would much prefer to provide every program, excursion and piece of equipment to you free of charge. But the harsh reality is that we have very finite funds, and we need to ask you regularly- far too regularly- for a contribution towards the substantial costs involved in educating your children well.

The discussion at the P&C meeting was lively and informed, and Sport News - Most Valued Players for 11/3/11 in the end the strong feeling of the meeting was that voluntary school contributions should be raised for 2011. An overwhelming majority voted in favour of a revised figure for this year of \$100 per student, with a cap of \$250 per family. It must be stated that this is still lower than any other school in Berowra. The amount raised will be dedicated towards 'buying' more time for our Support Teacher, Learning Assistance program. At the moment we have timetabled one day a week for this program, working with teachers in classes providing expert support for students experiencing difficulties in literacy and numeracy. This benefits ALL students, as it frees up classroom teachers to give more individual attention to the other students in the class.

At last week's P&C Meeting, there was considerable discussion More information about the voluntary school contribution will be sent to you early next term, including instalment payment options.


