

Welcome back for another busy term.

### **Voluntary School Contributions**

At the last P&C Meeting we had a lively and informed debate about the level of the school's voluntary contribution. An overwhelming majority voted in favour of a revised figure for this year of \$100 per student, with a cap of \$250 per family. I believe that this is still lower than the other Berowra schools.

The amount raised will help 'buy' more time for our Support Teacher, Learning Assistance program, enabling us to increase the time from one day a week to two days a week. Our highly skilled STLA, Mrs Sascha McIntyre, works with teachers in classes providing support for students experiencing difficulties in literacy and numeracy. This benefits all students by allowing classroom teachers to give more individual attention to the other students in the class.

I understand the resistance by some parents to paying an extra contribution to a school which is part of a 'free' public education system. As I stated last newsletter, we would love to provide every program, excursion and piece of equipment to you free of charge. But unfortunately good education costs money, and we have very finite funds.

Payment of the voluntary contribution is, obviously, voluntary, but I urge all parents to consider the benefits for their own children which will result from what is, when compared with fees charged by other schools in our area, a modest amount. Payment may be made by instalment, or in a single payment.

### **School Development Day**

Thank you for your consideration in accommodating the change in day for the School Development Day. I am sure that those parents who took up the opportunity to attend Andrew Fuller's evening session found it a highly rewarding experience. The day also gave our teachers the opportunity to meet and share ideas with teachers from other Primary schools in the Hornsby area.

#### **NAPLAN**

National Assessment Plan Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests are scheduled for Tuesday 10 May to Thursday 12 May for students in Year 3 and Year 5. The tests are designed to check how school systems and schools perform. Last year's results showed that New South Wales performed very well in all areas (Reading, Writing, Grammar and Maths) compared to other states. Berowra Public School also performed very well, achieving results above the state average.

While the tests have a broader national purpose, parents are understandably very interested in their own child's individual performance, and the data we receive is very useful in identifying areas for future development. However, it is important to remember that these tests gauge performance in a limited part of the curriculum, over a three day period. They do not provide a full picture of any individual child's achievement across the curriculum.

### **Behaviour Management Hints**

Each Crest this term will feature 2 or 3 expert hints about managing children's behaviour.

- Be consistent and fair. Don't change the rules on the run.
- Have the same rules for everyone.
- Do not allow the child to shift the blame ('someone made me do it', or 'someone did it as well and were not punished'). The child must accept responsibility for their own behaviour.


