Dogs on school grounds

Sometimes parents coming to collect children bring their dogs along for the walk. While this may be a good opportunity to give the dog a bit of exercise, unfortunately it is against the law to bring dogs onto school property. There are obvious safety reasons for this, both due to the danger that a dog (no matter how well trained or how well behaved) may become excitable or distressed when surrounded by noisy children, and of course the issue of dog droppings in the playground.

The NSW Consolidated Act states that dogs are prohibited from some public places. Section (e) of the Act specifically refers to schools and states that this applies to dogs whether they are leashed or unleashed. The exceptions are Assistance dogs trained to assist those who are sight or hearing impaired. I thank you for your anticipated co-operation in keeping dogs out of our playground.

After school arrangements

A recent incident at a nearby school provides an important reminder for us about being clear about pick-up arrangements with children- particularly younger children. As the children were in the playground at the end of the school day, a man approached a child and told him that he had been asked by the child's mother to pick him up. Fortunately the child saw his mother nearby and ran away.

It is important that children know the arrangements for the end of the day- who will pick them up or where they need to go. If there is a change to the routine, it is also important that the school be told about this.

Behaviour Management Hints

- Only threaten sanctions that you are prepared and able to carry out.
- ✓ Avoid threatening sanctions that are too harsh.
- ✓ If you tell a child they are naughty, they will often live up to your expectation.
