I will be here for this term. The position of principal at Kariong PS will be advertised during this term and who is principal of Berowra in term 2 depends on the outcome of this process.

School is busy and I thank all parents for their understanding and support of all our initiatives. I love seeing the children beginning most days with their fitness groups. These activities stimulate not only their fitness but also the brain. The enjoyment on their faces is also great to see during fitness and at Sportspro sports sessions on Fridays. It was good to see many parents watching their children during their sports lessons last Friday. Please remember you are very welcome to come and watch each Friday. Sportspro will be evaluated at the end of this term. I will send out a survey to evaluate this initiative. If all is positive we may look into using them again, but this will not be an all year activity. Please remember if you are finding it difficult to afford this please come and see me or drop me a note.

Another great initiative this year is the revamp of our existing Performing Arts Program. This year Mrs Sheldon will be taking each class for music/singing/choir lessons and Mrs Lukic will be working with classes on dance, dance appreciation and creative movement. The Monday morning Flag Assembly has been stopped. This assembly was eating into prime learning time. Children Year 1 to 6 line up on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday mornings outside Mrs Pickering's room. On Wednesday children go directly to Scripture. Important messages are delivered here and then the children are taken to their 20min fitness activity.

Whole school assemblies are held even weeks on Wednesdays in the hall at 12:45pm. These assemblies are totally run by the student leadership team. The sports captains are responsible for tabulating the class' house points and announcing the fortnightly winning house. The winning house for the term will be invited to a sausage sizzle at the end of the term. All parents are welcome to attend these assemblies. On odd weeks (this week) 3-6 Assembly is on Wednesdays at 12:45pm and K-2 Assembly is on Thursday at 12:45pm. Again all parents are welcome at these assemblies.

Just a quick reminder...please do not brings dogs into the school grounds and also we ask that you don't allow preschoolers to ride their bikes or scooters through our grounds.

Opening accounts for School Banking – great news! TUESDAY IS OUR SCHOOL BANKING DAY



Welcome to a new year. This is a short note to let you know that we are continuing with Dollarmite banking again this year at Berowra Public School and below is some information for all new parent and children who wish to start using school banking with us.

School Banking accounts can now be opened at any Commonwealth Bank branch. You no longer need to complete application forms and return them to school. Just go into any branch and ask to open a Youthsaver account for School Banking.

Remember to take in identification for you and your child (such as drivers license and birth certificate). You will receive a Dollarmites wallet and deposit book on the spot and be able to start banking on the next business day - it is that easy!

If you are a Commonwealth Bank customer with NetBank you have the option to open the account online as well!

Children can hand in their banking wallet to the class teacher on Tuesdays and it will be return to them later in the week. From January 2012 when children make their first deposit, they will get their first token and our school will also receive \$5 commission. Children are given tokens whenever they bank and can be redeemed for prizes throughout the year. Thank you for supporting our school and teaching your child good savings skills.
