Jump Rope for Heart School coordinator

In the lead up to the Jump Rope for Heart I wanted to share with you the story of how heart disease has impacted on my family. I lost my husband David to a heart attack three and a half years ago, when my daughter Emilie (now in kindergarten) was just 18 months old and I was pregnant with our son Shane, who is now three. Dave was healthy, had normal cholesterol levels and ignored some chest pain. By the time we found out he had heart disease it was too late, but it should not have been. If we were more aware of the signs, my children might not be growing up without their dad.

The reason I am sharing this with you is to encourage you to support the heart foundation through Jump Rope for Heart. When I read that heart disease will affect two thirds of the families at Berowra Public School, I almost cried. It is just too many. If just one person benefits from the research of the Heart Foundation, or is better aware of the signs of heart disease and gets help early enough, then it is worth it. Please encourage your kids to join in and encourage your friends and family to sponsor. And please, never ignore chest pain.

Internet safety presentation helps young people stay safe online

Dear Parent/ Caregiver,

To help your children stay safe online, Asquith Girls high School is hosting a Cybersmart Outreach—Internet Safety Awareness presentation. Parents and teachers from Asquith Girls, Asquith Boys and local primary schools are invited to attend this event provided by the Australian Communications and Media Authority (the ACMA) as part of a national program of cybersmart initiatives.

Young people today are immersed in digital technologies. They use the Internet and mobile phones to socialise, study, exchange ideas and play. While online activity has many benefits, there are also risks.

The Cybersmart Outreach—Internet Safety Awareness presentation is thorough and non-technical. It covers a range of issues including:

- the ways children use the internet and emerging technologies
- potential risks for children online, such as cyberbullying, identity theft, inappropriate contact and exposure to inappropriate content
- tips to help children stay safe online.

The presentation is conducted by an ACMA Cybersmart trainer and is free of charge.

Asquith Girls High is committed to helping students develop appropriate behaviours when using digital technologies, both at school and home. Our program of Internet safety initiatives includes:

- workshops to help combat cyber bullying
- resilience building strategies and a strong anti- bullying policy
- promotion of responsible laptop use
- police youth liaison officer presentations and discussions with students
