### NAPLAN 2013

The NAPLAN results were sent home after the last edition of the Crest. Here are a few highlights of our results:

- Year 5 (Boys) have improved by 57 scale scores from the 2012 data in the test aspect of Grammar & Punctuation.
- Year 3 (Girls) are 40 scale scores above the state average in the test aspect of Numeracy.
- Year 5 (Boys) are 7 scale scores above the state average growth in the test aspect of Numeracy.

In comparison with the Hornsby Network of Schools, we have made significant improvement this year:-

- Year 3 above local network of schools in Writing and Number, Patterns and Algebra.
- Year 5 improving the gap, especially in Number, Patterns and Algebra.

The results also indicate areas for improvement and focus for 2014. An analysis of Naplan is included in the annual school report and is reported on the My School website at: http://www.myschool.edu.au/

# BEROWRA SPORTS CLUBS' BEROWRA RECREATIONAL FACILITY PROJECT (BRFP)







WHAT IS BRFP? - BEROWRA . RECREATIONAL . FACILITY . PROJECT

### WHAT DOES BRFP MEAN?

The project is a large upgrade which mainly involves Berowra's four largest sports clubs; The Wallabies (rugby league) Berowra Soccer Club Berowra Netball Club Berowra Cricket Clubs

### STAGE 1:

- A. An extensive upgrade to the amenities block at Warrina St. Oval which is the original building (circa 1976). The project will double the current ground floor space with;
- Increased change room areas
- Significantly increased toilet facilities for both men and women toilets. These toilets will all be accessible during daylight hours through the installation of automatic timer locks (unlocking at sunrise & locking at sunset).
- Disabled toilet will also become a baby change facility.
- More storage facilities for both cricket and rugby league clubs
- Referees room
- Medics room
- Match day indoor BBQ facilities (for use during inclement weather)
- B. Construction of 2 unisex toilets and a disabled toilet on the Warwick Close side of Warrina St. Oval. This will service the junior soccer (Berowra Soccer Club) players and netball players (Berowra Netball Club) as well as their parents and supporters.
- The new toilet building will also have extensive and separate storage for the netball and soccer clubs.

### STAGE 2:

The construction of an additional floor on the amenities block for a club house and, or a general community meeting space (50 – 60 people).

This will include:

- a viewing balcony overlooking the sports field
- disabled access to the second floor with a disabled toilet
- access to the downstairs toilets internally
- a general use office

Note: It is the intention of the BRFP committee to complete as much of stage 2 during the construction of stage 1 to minimize the impact of construction at Warrina St. Oval and the associated costs by getting the majority into one construction period. However this depends on the project's fundraising capabilities.

### STAGE 3 (being considered for Council funding in 2016/17):

<sup>2</sup> Construction of an exercise circuit around the facility (with concrete path) with implementation of exercise stations complete with permanent equipment.

• Terracing the embankment between the netball courts and junior soccer field.

### WHO WILL BENEFIT FROM THE BRFP AND HOW?

**The four sports clubs** (the Wallabies, Soccer, Netball and Cricket clubs) will enjoy long overdue improved, increased and brand new facilities (toilets, storage, change rooms, sports club location etc.).

The community will have access to a meeting/event facility with capacity of up to 150 people.

**General public** - users of the sports field open space area, as well as the popular kids park and BBQ facility - will have access to increased facilities during daylight hours every day including:

- Disabled toilet/baby change room
- Men's toilet (3 times more capacity than current)
- Women's toilet (4 times more capacity than current)
- Toilets will also be available on the Warwick Close side of Warrina St. Oval for general public use

Other users of Warrina St. Oval such as the local schools will also have access to these improved facilities.

### WHEN IS THE BRFP CONSTRUCTION TAKING PLACE?

Construction starts 3rd December 2013 and is due for completion at the end of March 2014 (just in time for the winter sports season).

The greater majority of the skilled labour and materials is either being donated to the project. Therefore the timetable also depends on the availability of these things.

### HOW IS THE BRFP BEING FUNDED?

Stage 1 and Stage 2 are being wholly funded through State Government grants, local community group's funding commitments and extensive fundraising by the BRFP committee.

Stage 3 is being planned into Hornsby Shire Council works program for 2016/17.

### HOW CAN YOU HELP?

You can support the BRFP a number of ways.
