#### **School Fence**

Just after the last Crest was published BPS became the owners of a new security fence. Unexpectedly, this also included the back gateway being closed off. School Security organised this fence and I was under the impression that the fence was only going along Berowra Waters Rd. The walkway has been closed off due to the enormous amount of vandalism during the weekends and holiday periods. Unfortunately, we have, on occasions, found teenagers on our premises during school time. They have been found coming out of the toilets and a couple of times been seen coming out of unoccupied classrooms. This added security should hinder teenagers from entering the school grounds during the day. The gate to the walkway will be open from 8:30 to 9:45am and then from 3:00 to 4:00pm each day.

I would like to thank all parents for your understanding and support during the afternoon of the closure of the fence. I was in 'panic mode' during this time and the fact that you understood our predicament and coped with the disruption was very helpful.

#### Safety around the school

Please be very careful in the streets surrounding our school. The Drop Off Zone is only for dropping off and picking up. This part of the street is not for taking your child/ren into school.

"The driver is to pull into the 'Drop-off and Pick-up' zone and remain in control of the vehicle while the school student exits or enters the vehicle."

Please also be careful not to drive over double lines (make a U turn) and park in the bus zone or no stopping zone in front of the school.

Students riding bikes to and from school MUST have a helmet. Skateboards are not permitted in the school grounds so please do not ride skateboards to and from school.

#### 200th Anniversary of the Blue Mountains crossing

On May 11<sup>th</sup> 2013 it was the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the crossing of the Blue Mountains by Blaxland, Wentworth and Lawson. Since the arrival of the first fleet the settlers from England couldn't grow enough crops and homes for animals because the Blue Mountains were blocking a lot of land that was urgently needed.

When the settlers had no more land to harvest and look after animals three men decided to conquer the Blue Mountains and go searching for land. These brave men's names were Blaxland, Wentworth and Lawson.

Blaxland was a very wealthy man, Lawson was a surveyor and Wentworth is a son of a doctor. On their trip they had four fully packed horses to carry their supplies and equipment. When these men travelled through the Mountains they stuck to the ridges. When the three men reached a mountain called Mt York they walked along the ridges looking out for land. A few hours later they were coming to the end of the mountain and couldn't see anything until Lawson saw at least 100 acres of land for the crops to grow and the sheep to stay. The three men had found the land they needed. So the three men conquered the Blue Mountains and found land. They were heroes.

Now in the Blue Mountains there are suburbs and memorials named after them.

#### 200th Anniversary of the crossing of the Blue Mountains

On 11th May 1813, three brave explorers named Gregory Blaxland, William Wentworth and William Lawson decided to cross the Blue Mountains only 43 years after the discovery of Australia by Captain Cook and 25 years after the arrival of the first fleet. It was a long and dangerous journey, but they made it. It took them 21 days to complete the trip, but it was all worthy it. Especially since the need for new grazing land was colossal. It was a long and dangerous journey because they had to hack their way through the bush, they had to climb up and down cliff faces and they had to dig through lots and lots of dirt. Today, just west of Katoomba you can see the remains of a Eucalyptus tree marked by the famous explorers Blaxland, Wentworth and Lawson. The Marked Tree, along with Caley's Repluse at Lawson, are the only remaining marks of the early explorers. A cairn of stones was also placed at Linden; however, we can not be certain if the existing cairn at Linden is the original. The Blue Mountains are remarkable places to be. The blue colour, the mountain ranges themselves, everything. It's completely remarkable. 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
