A Good Place to Start...

Let's begin the term well so that the school community continues to be a supportive co-operative one where all students, parents and cultures are valued and students learn in a safe happy environment.

Some important points to remember are ...

- Motorists need to drive safely in the streets surrounding the school remembering to use the Kiss & Drop Zones responsibly. This means avoiding stopping in NO STOPPING Zones, double parking and parking across driveways (especially the staff car park).
- Parents must not approach any child other than their own child in the school playground or as a child travels home from school. This happens when a parent wants to discuss a problem their child is experiencing at school. Concerns should be discussed with school staff who will speak to all children involved.
