<u>PERFORMING ARTS NEWS</u> - It's very exciting to see so many of our performance groups up and running for the year already. 2014 promises to be another great year for BPS with Junior & Senior Drama groups, Junior & Senior Choirs, Boys Dance Group, Girls Dance Group, Training Band, Concert Band, Rock Band, Recorder groups and String Ensemble all busily scheduling rehearsals and finalising group members. There are so many opportunities for our students who would like enrichment through various performing arts. Some groups are unfortunately limited in the number of children able to participate, with these restrictions usually dictated by performance venues, whilst others are open to all. Please feel free to contact me if you have any queries regarding your child's involvement with these groups.

However the musical enrichment of Berowra students is not limited to students' participation in these specialty groups. Countless studies have established links between music learning and improved academic and social outcomes in children. Music engages both sides of the brain – the logical, analytical left side and the creative, innovative, problem-solving right side. Hence, *music* remains an integral part of the Creative and Performing Arts (CAPA) curriculum and is therefore taught in every classroom. Whilst for the last few years, I had the opportunity to teach music as a specialty subject to all classes, I am now focussing on assisting all teachers in developing their skills in music education. During the holidays I was fortunate enough to be offered a scholarship to attend the inaugural *TunEd Up* residency program run by the Sydney Symphony Orchestra. I spent five days at Sydney University learning various ways to enhance music education in our school, with inspiring workshops led by SSO and Conservatorium of Music tutors. I was also involved in discussions with ACARA, our national curriculum authority, and in particular the authors of the new National Curriculum for The Arts, due for release this year. It's going to be a musical year at BPS!

Liz Sheldon Performing Arts Co-ordinator CHOIR - Junior Choir is open to all students in Year 1 & 2 and this year we will be rehearsing at lunchtime on Thursdays. 
