In the light of the very sad incident at another public school last Friday week, I wanted to speak directly of the tree maintenance and management program at BPS. The trees in our school are assessed each 6 months on a cyclic basis using a reputable tree service. They have been used by the school over the past 8 years. Trees in the playground are inspected, pruned and all dead wood removed at least twice per year. I want to reassure parents that the school takes the issue of trees in the school very seriously and a number of trees have been removed over the past years as soon as they are deemed unsafe. The most recent time the trees were actually pruned and dead branches removed was on Saturday, 22<sup>nd</sup> February.

During high wind days we keep the children away from the trees and unfortunately some lunch times the children have been kept inside for their safety.

### **Swimming Carnival**

Our swimming carnival ran 'like clockwork' on Monday with many competitors gaining PBs (personal best times). Many thanks to Mr Jones and his band of merry teachers who worked tirelessly both before and at the carnival to ensure the smooth running. Many thanks to the many parents who supported the day either by assisting with judging, working in the canteen, cheering and supporting the carnival. Again a huge thank you to **Wayne Bingham** for donating his time, equipment and expertise. We are truly fortunate to have these wonderful parents, grandparents and community members at BPS.

I was very impressed with the non-competitors at the carnival. It is inspiring to see them joining in during the day and cheering on their friends who are competing. They also enjoyed their 25m races. Next year we are hoping to have at least three 25m races for the non-competitors.

This carnival (as with the other carnivals during the year) is part of the PE/H/PD syllabus and as this is our curriculum **all children in Years 3-6 should be in attendance**.





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
