

Only one and a half weeks to go before the school holidays. This term has been a busy one with many great learning experiences for the students.

Thank you to all parents who used the new online booking for interviews this week. From all comments it seems to be a positive experience but we will have a close look at the online booking system after all interviews are completed. On behalf of the staff and myself, we hope you have a restful and safe holiday and I hope the Easter Bunny leaves many Easter treats.

Late Arrivals

Many children are beginning to arrive late at school, without parent consent. Children must come to the office and fill out a green late slip before going to class. This is to be signed by a parent and returned to the teacher. It is concerning to see children arriving late as this interrupts their learning and also disrupts their class when they arrive. Please also remember that if the reason they are late is due to : sleeping in, running late, sister wouldn't get out of bed, couldn't find my shoes, etc; the reason is unjustified. When we have a series of these, the Home School Liaison Office may be come involved.

Notes from School

Thank you to all parents for your patience in waiting for this to happen. I have spoken this morning with them and we are set the launch for term 2. We are still waiting on updated contact details for many families but we will go ahead no matter what next term. They have worked out the 'glitches' with the third party operating system by bypassing it.

Changeable Weather

At the moment the weather is very unpredictable. We often experience heavy rain just in time for the end of the day. An overwhelming number of children do not have raincoats in their bag, so that they are prepared for the change in weather. Many children who are waiting in the bus lines or to be picked up at Kiss and Drop are getting soaked. In the interests of your children's health, please assist by ensuring your child has a raincoat in their bag each day. Please do not send umbrellas as these become a safety issue. Children will not be allowed to use them in the school grounds.

Kiss and Drop Zone

A 'Kiss and Ride Zone' or 'Drop-off and Pick-up' area utilises existing 'No Parking' zones around schools. In these areas, drivers may stop to drop off or pick up children, however **No Parking** rules apply:

- Maximum stop time is 2 minutes
- · Driver must remain in or within 3 metres of the vehicle
- · Vehicle must not be left unattended

Additional safety tips for school zones:

- · Always drop-off or pick-up your child from the designated area, following the school's procedures.
- Make sure children use the footpath-side door when getting in and out of a car.
- · If your child is not on the footpath do not wait please drive off and come back.
- Never double park.
- Never park across a pedestrian crossing.
- Never undertake a U-turn in close proximity to the school.

Staff Development Day

Term Two Staff Development Day will be held on Monday, 28th April, this is a pupil free day. The teachers will be meeting here with our local community of schools (Wideview, Mt Kuring-gai, Cowan and Brooklyn). We will be looking at Visual Literacy from the new English Syllabus and consolidating our new reports for semester one, to ensure consistency across our five schools.

Students return on Tuesday, 29th April, wearing their summer uniform. Changeover to winter uniform is usually around the middle to end of May, depending on the weather.

Photo Day is Tuesday 6th May (Week 2) and students are to wear summer uniform.

Naplan 2014

In May 2014 the National Assessment Program- Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3 and 5. The results of the test provide important information about what each student can do and is used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating your child's level of achievement, reported against the national minimum standard.

Naplan testing is on Tuesday, 13th May, Wednesday, 14th May and Thursday, 15th May, 2014.

Students and the Social Media

Many of our community know of or are an active member of social media sites such as: Facebook, Skype, Meebo, Twitter, Kik.. and the list goes on! Therefore, many of our children are members of many of these sites as well. Social media is a relatively new phenomenon that I am sure is here to stay.

We as adults and parents in this relationship must endeavour to ensure that the children are fully aware of their responsibilities when on the net and the ramifications that follow from irresponsible use of social media.

Over the last few years I have had cause to intervene and discuss with parents inappropriate behaviours and fractured friendships after a weekend or a night of social net interaction. It is much easier to say hurtful things to or

about someone when you are looking at a keyboard rather than a human face. What is typed and posted cannot be withdrawn. I urge all parents to reinforce my message to our older students to be net aware and net polite. It is never too early to start! Technology and access is changing so quickly that our children need safe and sure support.

Students forgetting their lunches

A number of students are going to the canteen and saying they don't have lunch thinking they can get something else to eat. If your child has forgotten to bring their lunch they are to see the class teacher as early as possible, or the office who will try phoning you.

If we are unable to contact you in time, the canteen will always give your child a sandwich and an account will be sent home. Please remember the canteen is only open Wednesday to Friday.
