#### **Mobile Phones at School**

Our school policy is that all students who bring mobile phones to school are required to sign them into the office on arrival and pick them up at the end of the day. We follow this procedure for several reasons:-

Not a distraction in the classroom or playground

Protection from theft or breakage

Reduce inappropriate use

However, we do understand that at times a student may need to use their phone during the day and they have been made aware that if this is the case they can speak to their class teacher and we can arrange for them to use their phone, for a legitimate reason, in private.

It would be appreciated if you could please discuss this procedure with your child to ensure safe usage and storage of phones at our school.

#### Wild Weather

As most of you will know our school sustained some damage as a result of the storms last weekend. Reports for all damages were reported first thing Monday morning but of course with all things of this kind jobs need to be prioritised.

Hornsby Council organised to have the path covered by the fallen tree cleared on High Street however the rest of the tree and damage to the fence needs to be assessed and will be removed through an insurance claim. The roof on B Block was repaired in order to make it safe but further assessment and work will be required.

Two other minor jobs will also be completed after insurance assessments have been completed. Glad the long weekend was brighter.

#### **Family Assistance**

At certain times all of us go through difficult times. Please be reassured that the school can assist with school payments and in other ways if necessary. We encourage you to contact the school to organise alternative methods of payment or partial assistance if you require them. We are here to help so please let us know. We would not want to see any child miss out on an event or go without because of difficulties that arise with home finances.

#### **Breakfast Club**

In line with our offer of family assistance, we have had queries from parents and teachers asking how they might assist, in a practical way, students who may need a little bit of extra care. One way that has been suggested is to set up a 'Breakfast Club' to cater for those students who may not have the opportunity or resources to eat a healthy breakfast prior to coming to school.

Our breakfast club would be open to all students however, our intention is to reach those students with the greatest need.

Set up costs for 'Breakfast Club' will initially be funded by a generous parent donation that we have received but then we would need to seek support from other areas to continue this service. Of course any donations of fruit, bread, spreads or cereals would be gratefully accepted at any time.

The club will be held in BOOSH from 8.50 – 9.20 each morning. BOOSH have also very kindly offered to supply all necessary cutlery and crockery. Several teachers have already asked to assist and we would gratefully accept any parent who may occasionally like to offer their assistance as well. 


