We are fortunate at BPS to have great students. Our students are well rounded and participate in all the school has to offer. Most students also participate in many activities outside of school.


Last week I was so proud to see so many amazing achievements from














Mathletics

VOLUNTEERS - WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECKS

The majority of parents or close relatives who volunteer at their child's school are exempt from obtaining a WWCC from Service NSW, and will continue to be exempt. That means day-to-day reading helpers, canteen helpers, etc., who are a parent or close relative to a child at the school at which they are volunteering - DO NOT need a WWCC number.

They should complete the Department of Education Appendix 5 (Declaration for volunteers and non child related contractors) and provide the school with 100 points of ID. This is available from the school office.

Volunteering can include transporting students to sports carnivals, small group work in classrooms, canteen helpers, morning tea helpers, disco helpers, BBQ helpers or working on Mother's or Father's Day stalls.

"Close relative" of a person means:

i. a spouse or de facto partner of the person, or

ii. a child, step-child, sibling, step-sibling, parent, step-parent, grandparent, step-grandparent, aunt, uncle, niece or nephew of the person, and includes, in the case of an Aboriginal person or a Torres Strait Islander, persons who are part of the extended family or kin of the person according to the indigenous kinship system of the person's culture.

If you are an employee of the Department of Education then you need to come to see the **principal** with your driver's licence and she will clear you for volunteering at our school. You do not need to complete Appendix 5 or provide the school with 100 points of ID.

Every time you come to school to volunteer, please ensure you sign in at the office and wear your visitor's badge while on BPS grounds.

ATTENDANCE

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE – It's NOT ok to stay away

All children have the Right to an Education.

Regular School attendance lets students develop a sense of belonging and builds important coping and friendship skills. Confident children are less likely to engage in anti-social behaviour.

When students miss out on basic skills in the early years of school they may have learning problems in later years. In the long run, unsatisfactory attendance may affect the opportunities available to your child.

Parents are required by law to ensure all children from 6 to 17 year olds are enrolled at and regularly attend school or are registered with the Office of the Board of Studies NSW for home schooling.

Be on time. Be at school. That's the rule!

Please provide this information in writing to the principal. This will greatly assist our school in planning to support your child's health and wellbeing.



Please also remember to notify staff in the school office of any changes to your contact details or to the contact details of other people nominated as emergency contacts.

We appreciate your assistance in this regard and assure you that any information you provide the school will be stored securely and will only be used or disclosed in order to support your son or daughter's health needs or as otherwise required by law.

STAGE

If you pass by the BPS orchard you are likely to wonder about the array of new contraptions that have sprung up. The garden area there is awash with a huge variety of student designed and constructed greenhouses.

These greenhouses are the culmination of a Stage 3 unit on sustainability and have involved many hours of student work in science. The test is to see how effective each greenhouse is at producing a winter crop from seeds. The effectiveness is being tested against seeds which have been planted out in the open in the general garden area by each class. Throughout the process there has been lots of collaboration between the students and many creative designs are on show.

We will be leaving on the weekend following the Berowra Woodchop Festival, August 17, 18 and 19 (Friday to Sunday).
