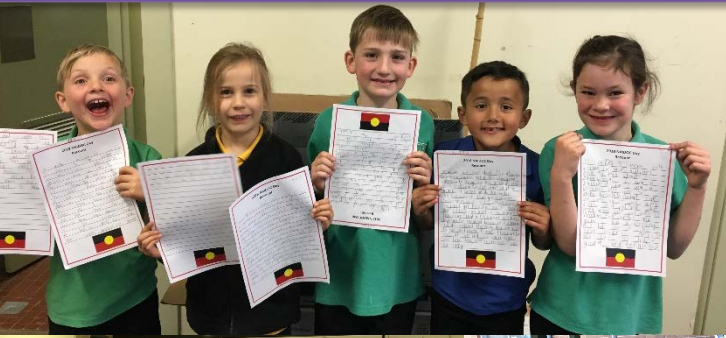

8-15 JULY 2018

After morning tea the children were put into mixed groups and they became a 'clan'. In their clan they selected a totem and made bracelets to symbolise their clan and totem.

They had to build a shelter, the elders had to lead the clans to find food and think of tools they might use to help them in their daily life. The clans discussed 'women's and men's business'. Talking about their different responsibilities to their clan. Next they negotiated a 'marriage' between their clan and another clan. During all of this there was a 'kangaroo' jumping around the school for all the clans to hunt.

The activities finished with a corroboree – where they shared food and danced.

Many thanks to Coles Berowra who donated water melons for our 'feast'.

I am so proud to be part of such a dynamic and enthusiastic school and community. I am positive all children enjoyed the entire day.

I would personally like to acknowledge our wonderful visitors for their dedication to our school and students, our exceptional teachers and enthusiastic students. I would also like to thank our Year 6 students who ensured their groups were at the right spot at the right time and made certain all students in their group were involved and enjoying the day.

Just a few more..... **Miss Roberts** who coordinated and led the day, with her committee. All our teachers who led groups and ensured they gained an in depth knowledge and respect of Aboriginal Culture. I need to also mention that this was all done during a horrible wind storm.

Student Wellbeing

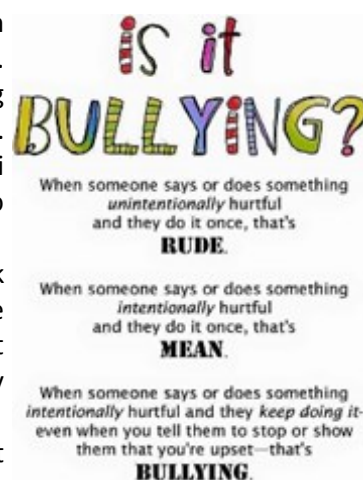
At our school we have very high expectations regarding student behaviour and I am very happy to say that all of our children reach those expectations most of the time. We use a positive approach to student discipline by setting clear limits, recognising appropriate behaviour and applying consequences to inappropriate behaviour. Behaviour that infringes on the safety of others such as harassment, bullying or anti-social behaviour of any kind is not tolerated from anyone and will be responded to appropriately.

We understand that children will occasionally make the wrong choice and we work with them to make better choices should that or a similar situation arise again. We encourage our students to let us know if a situation is occurring that they can't handle and we support them by providing them with the skills they need to rectify the situation or we intervene appropriately.

If your child comes home and shares a concern that involves another student at school we ask all parents to contact the class teacher in the first instance.

Under no circumstances are parents to make contact with another child in regards to a conflict that is happening at school or on the way to and from school. It is inappropriate and often escalates the problem.

If you have concerns or an issue arises please let the school know so we can deal with it appropriately.

Emergency Procedures

Evacuation Alarm – bell will ring continuously.

Cybersafety for students

How to behave online

Staying safe online is partly up to how you behave. Think about:

- How am I portraying myself to others and why?
- Do I treat others respectfully? Do I treat others as I would like to be treated?
- How do I make decisions about my behaviour when online?
- What message am I giving the world with my photos online?
- What is the impact on me? My family and friends?
- How would I feel if my information or images were seen by others?
- Have I kept my personal details private?
- Who knows my passwords and my numbers?
- How do I respond to inappropriate behaviour from others?

Bullying online (cyberbullying)

Bullying online (sometimes called cyberbullying) is using technology to deliberately and repeatedly bully someone else. It can happen to anyone, anytime, and can leave you feeling unsafe and alone.

Bullying online can include:

- abusive texts and emails
- posting unkind messages or images
- imitating others online
- excluding others online
- inappropriate image tagging.

Bullying online can be offensive and upsetting and you don't have to put up with it.

If you are being bullied, stay CALM and THINK clearly:

- Do not respond to the message when you're angry or upset.
- Tell someone: a parent or carer, relative, adult friend or teacher.
- Ask your teacher if your school has a policy in place to deal with bullying if it happens online.

Protect yourself on the phone

- Give your phone number to friends only.
- Keep your mobile phone away from those who shouldn't have your phone number.
- Use ID blocking on your phone to hide your number when you call others.
- Think about whether it is appropriate to send your messages or make a call.
- Regularly check privacy settings on your mobile phone
- For help use the privacy features on your phone call your mobile company's customer care number.

Protect yourself on social networking sites

- Regularly check and re-set the privacy settings on your social networking profiles
- Most social networking profiles start with minimum privacy; make sure you select the settings you need to share your personal information only with those you want to.
- Don't share your passwords, even with friends.
- Think about whether you would want other people to see your images; some images should not be posted in public places.

Report it

- Keep records of calls or messages that are offensive or hurtful.
