HEALTH AND SAFETY IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY

A reminder to parents to notify the school about your child's health

We welcome information from parents about your child's health, even if you are not requesting specific support from our school.

Our school asks for medical information when you enrol your child. It is also important that you let us know if your child's health care needs change or if a new health condition develops. Information about allergies, medical conditions such as asthma

and diabetes and other health care related issues (including prior conditions such as medical procedures in the last 12 months) should be provided to the school by parents. Please provide this information in writing to the principal. This will greatly assist our school in planning to support your child's health and wellbeing.

Please also remember to notify staff in the school office of any changes to your contact details or to the contact details of other people nominated as emergency contacts.

We appreciate your assistance in this regard and assure you that any information you provide the school will be stored securely and will only be used or disclosed in order to support your son or daughter's health needs or as otherwise required by law.



Use of School Equipment Before and After School

To ensure the safety of all students we request that parents do not allow their children on the school equipment before and after school, unless they are being closely supervised by an adult.

ALLERGIC REACTIONS - STUDENT HEALTH AND WELLBEING

What are allergies?

Allergies occur when an overactive immune system produces antibodies (IgE) against substances in the environment (allergens) that are usually harmless. Exposure to an allergen can result in symptoms that vary from mild to life-threatening.

What is anaphylaxis?

Anaphylaxis is the most severe form of allergic reaction and is potentially life-threatening.

Anaphylaxis is severe and sudden generalised multi-system allergic reaction and can occur when a susceptible person is exposed to an allergen (such as certain foods or an insect sting). Reactions usually begin within minutes of exposure and can progress rapidly over a period of up to two hours or more. Anaphylaxis is potentially life-threatening and always requires an emergency response.

How common is anaphylaxis in Australia?

Anaphylaxis is uncommon but not rare and is more common in children than adults. An Australian survey of parent-reported allergy and anaphylaxis found that 1 in 170 school children had suffered at least one episode of anaphylaxis.

The most common triggers of anaphylaxis are:

Foods (e.g. peanuts, tree nuts, fish, shellfish, cow's milk and other dairy foods, eggs, sesame, soy) n Insects (e.g. bee stings, wasp stings, jack jumper ant bites.

Latex (e.g. rubber gloves, balloons, swimming caps).

Medications: including natural and herbal products.

Antibiotics (usually penicillin) are the most commonly reported trigger for medication allergy.

The most common forms of anaphylaxis are from food products.

Book Club



School Opal Card Compliance

One of our key focuses this year is to improve Opal compliance among students.

We found that the common reasons students don't tap on are:

- They do not hold an Opal card and have never applied for it largely because they are ineligible or live too close to the school
- They have lost or forgotten their Opal card but have not replaced it
- They might have a valid car, but don't see any reason to tap on and off
- The driver does not enforce it or ask them to tap on
- Insufficient funds on their Child/Youth Opal card

Every time a student TAPS ON and OFF, they are counted on our service—when they don't, they are invisible. Without accurate patronage data, Transport for NSW have the option to withdraw low patronised services.

Our drivers are now expected to ask students to TAP ON when they board.
