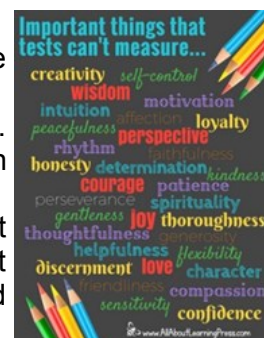
NAPLAN

Attendance

A reminder that it is vital that students arrive at school on time, ready to begin learning, each day. Students arriving at school after the bell need to go to the office for a late note. Where possible an adult needs to accompany the student to the office and fill in a late notice and then take them to class.

When children are late the school records it as a partial absence.

It is also important that all students who are walking or riding bikes come directly to school in the morning and go straight home in the afternoon without diverting.



Road Safety Education



Never call to your children from across a road – teach them to wait until you cross and come to them.

Always wait for the 'Lollypop Lady' to gesture you to cross the road.

Health and Safety is everyone's responsibility

If there is an emergency and you are going to be late picking your child up after school please inform the office during school hours.

If you inform the school too close to the bell, we may not be able to get the message to your child in time. Please be mindful of Friday afternoon sport as well.

Please remind your child to **always** go to the office if you are unexpectedly late for pick up. That way your child stays safe at all times.



Visitors to our school

All **visitors** and **volunteers** to our school are required to **sign in at the office when they arrive** at the school prior to going to classrooms and **sign out when they depart**. Visitors and volunteers are also required to **wear a visitor's badge** provided by the office staff to ensure students, staff and other visitors can easily identify everyone on the school site and go through the safety briefing each year with the office staff.

If there is something special on at school, including a special assembly, presentation or open classrooms, you will not be required to sign in.

Parents and carers coming to the school to pick up students (prior to end of day) are required to sign their child out at the office prior to collecting their child from the classroom or playground. For student safety, teachers are instructed not to allow children to leave with a parent unless they provide the purple 'Parent Authorisation Slip'.

Working with Children Checks

The majority of parents or close relatives who volunteer at their child's school are exempt from obtaining a WWCC through Service NSW, and will continue to be exempt.

That means day to day reading helpers, canteen helpers etc, who are a parent or close relative to a child at the school at which they are volunteering, DO NOT need a WWCC number and **should not** be asked to provide one (please note – these positions are not classed as formal mentoring).

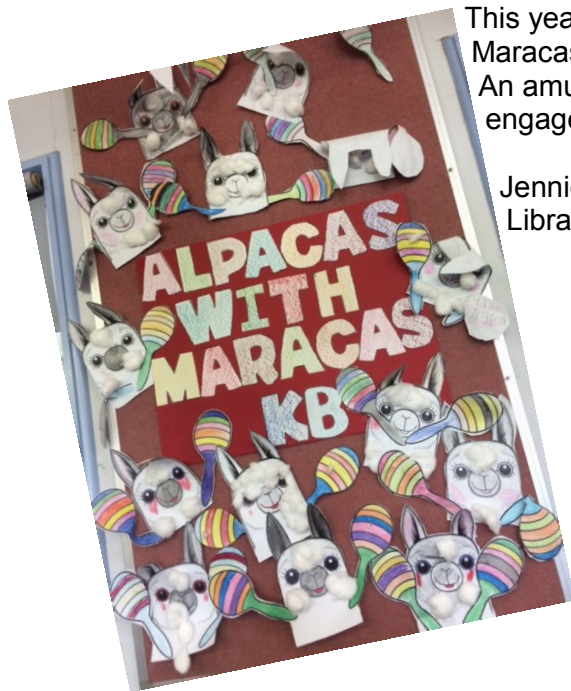
However, they should complete the **Appendix 5** and provide the school with 100 points of ID.

- Helping with reading groups - they need the Appendix 5 + 100 points of ID.
- Accompanying students on excursions - they need the Appendix 5 + 100 points of ID.
- Helping at the School Support Group run discos - they need the Appendix 5 + 100 points of ID.
- Helping with school morning teas during events at school - they need the Appendix 5 + 100 points of ID.

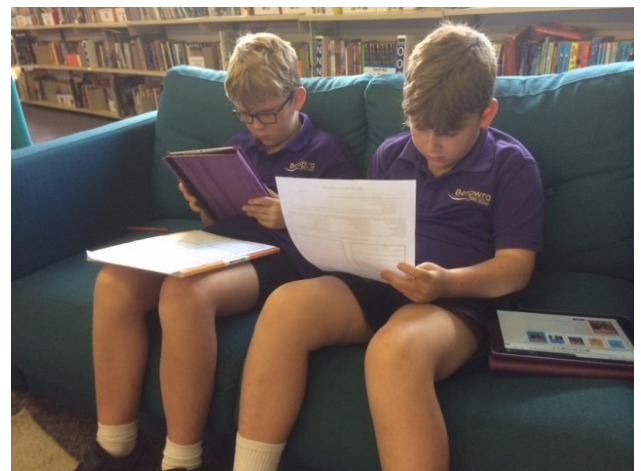
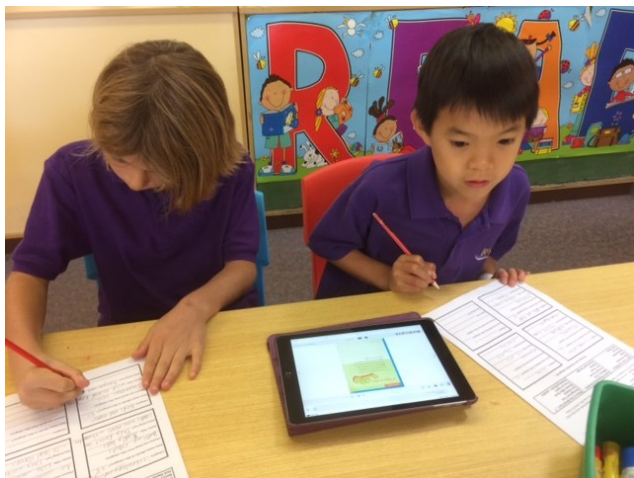
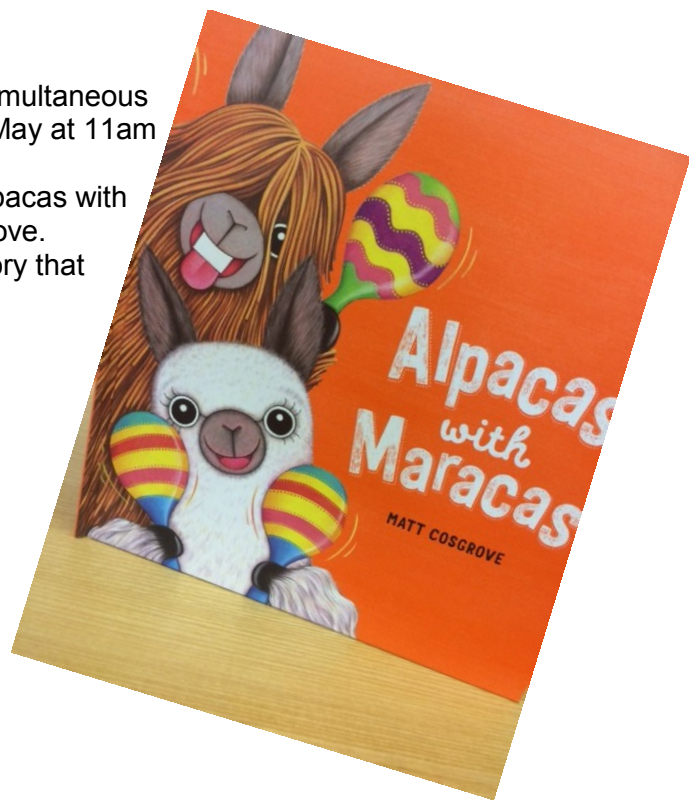
LIBRARY NEWS

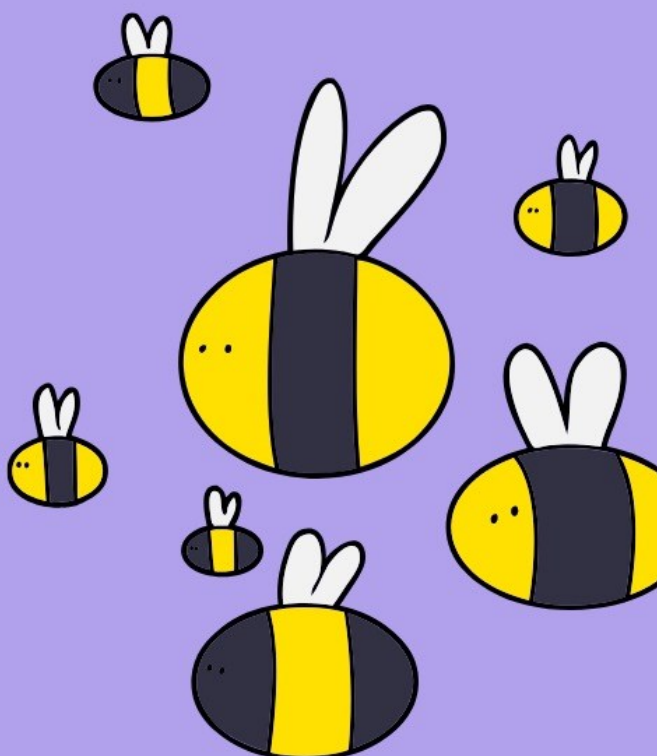

Money Collection Procedures

- BPS payment/permission envelopes with cash or cheque enclosed are not to go to the classroom teacher.
- All money envelopes and permission notes are to be 'posted' in the letterbox attached to the wall in the office foyer. This can be done by children or parents prior to school or during recess and lunch - not during class time.
- Gold coin donations for mufti days can still go to the classroom and will be collected by the organising group.
- Please do not put canteen money in the school letterbox. Go to the canteen when it is open or post it in the canteen letterbox.
- Money collection days are still Tuesday and Thursday so please do not sent payments to school on other days.
- The Department's preferred method of payment is Parent Online Payment (POP) accessed through the school website, by clicking on 'Make a Payment' tab.
- You can access POP any time, any day and you don't need correct money.

Claim your ACTIVE KIDS Rebate

The NSW Government is helping kids get active with the new Active Kids Program.

Parents, guardians and carers can apply for a voucher valued up to \$100 per calendar year for each student enrolled in school.

The voucher may be used with a registered activity provider for registration, participation and membership costs for sport, fitness and active recreation activities.

The voucher can be used at any time during the calendar year it was issued

In 2019 families will not only be able to claim \$100 for the Active Kids Rebate but \$100 for the Creative Kids Rebate.

This will cover music lessons, drama and theatre, language classes, visual arts, coding and design.
