Dear Parents and Caregivers,

### **Pedestrian safety: walking and crossing roads**

The next few weeks the RMS is unable to consistently provide a crossing supervisor. Berowra Public School executive will try and monitor the busy crossings. Teachers will remind all students of road safety. I ask that at home road safety is also highlighted.

You can help children develop pedestrian safety skills and road safety skills by giving them plenty of practice around real roads – for example, by walking with children to and from school, around the block or to the local shops.

While your child is learning, these pedestrian safety guidelines will help prevent accidents:

- **Hold your child's hand** when crossing roads together and wherever there's traffic or cars. Take special care where there's heavy traffic, high-speed traffic, narrow or non-existent footpaths, or things that block the view, like parked cars and trucks, trees, hill crests or crowded footpaths.
- Always cross at pedestrian crossings or corners, wait for the lights, and look in every direction to check there are no cars coming. To help your child understand about when and where it's safe to cross, explain what you're doing.
- Stop at driveways and check there are no cars reversing or entering.
- Start talking about road safety while your child is still in the stroller. For example, 'Uh oh, car coming. Better wait until it's gone before we cross'. Keep talking about road safety as he grows.
- 

As you walk together or when you're near roads, you can ask your child **simple questions** to get her thinking about pedestrian and road safety:

- Where is the safest place to cross this road?
- What do we need to do before we cross the road together?
- Why do we hold hands to cross the road together?
- When is it safe to cross the road?
- What do we look for when crossing the road?
- What sounds are we listening for when we cross the road?

Our children are precious and road safety is paramount.

### **Online Payment**

## The simplest way

Serves: 4 | Prep time: 15 min | Cooking time: 20 min

### Ingredients

1 sweet potato, peeled  
2 carrots, peeled  
2 parsnips, peeled  
1 large beetroot, peeled  
Sprigs of fresh rosemary or thyme  
Olive oil spray  
Sea salt



### Method

Pre-heat oven to 190°C. Slice all the vegies into thin rounds. Spread them out on paper towels and blot dry, ensure they're as dry as possible.

Line a baking tray with foil and lightly spray with olive oil. Spread the vegies and herbs on the tray and spray them with olive oil and add a dash of salt. Bake for approx. 20 minutes, checking every 5 mins. to ensure they're not burning. Remove any that are brown and crispy before the others.

Parents, guardians and carers can apply for a voucher valued up to \$100 per calendar year for each student enrolled in school.

The voucher may be used with a registered activity provider for registration, participation and membership costs for sport, fitness and active recreation activities.

The voucher can be used at any time during the calendar year it was issued

In 2019 families will not only be able to claim \$100 for the Active Kids Rebate but \$100 for the Creative Kids Rebate.

This will cover music lessons, drama and theatre, language classes, visual arts, coding and design.
