
Over the next few newsletters I will continue to share information about formative assessment.

#### **Learning Intentions**

When students know the learning intention of a lesson, they

- are helped to focus on the purpose of the activity, rather than simply completing the activity;
- know where to focus their efforts ie which part of the activity actually encompasses the learning;
- are more likely to stay 'on task' and less likely to be confused or distracted;
- can take more responsibility for learning.

Focusing on the learning - the skills, knowledge and understanding - rather than on the context has the advantage of making it more likely that students will be able to transfer their learning from one context to another.



Having decided on the learning intention, teachers plan a series of *teaching and learning activities* to help students learn the knowledge and/or skills and achieve the understanding described.

While *questioning* the students, they keep the learning intention in mind and this provides a focus for the lesson.

They design an assessment task which will allow students to demonstrate that they have achieved the learning intention and provide students with the success criteria so that they will know what they need to do to show that they have achieved the learning intention.

They make certain that feedback to students about their performance focuses on the learning intention and success criteria; likewise, when students assess their own performance, they too focus on the learning intention and success criteria.

#### Macglit

We are really excited! The Macqlit program is being implemented at Berowra Public school. Some children who are not making

literacy milstones will have the oppportunity to be part of this program

The Macqlit program is an evidence-based program designed to be delivered to small groups of students, it has been developed by a literacy research initiative at Macquarie University. It is specifically aimed at older (Year 3 and older) low-progress readers. Lessons will be delivered 4 times per week. Macqlit focuses on the five pillars of reading instruction: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension. The lessons teach essential skills such as:

- Letter-sound correspondence presented in an easy to hard sequence
- Strategies for decoding mulit-syllable words
- Prefixes and suffixes
- Using the taught skills through connected text reading

The team look forward to sharing the growth data with you.

The recorder ensemble played three pieces which they had been working on all year with Dr. Sue Thorvaldson; "Simple gifts", "Bluz for Suz" and "Three Brothers".

In "Three Brothers", Evangeline Morrison from class 6P was selected to do a solo on the smallest of the recorders - the sopranino. Evie stood on the main stage with 700 recorders behind her, an orchestra, a grand piano and three harps. She performed with confidence and poise, completely from memory, and could be heard strong and clear above all of the other instruments. It was a proud moment for Berowra Public School, and hopefully one that Evie will remember forever.

Overall it was a fantastic evening. Each performance showed a remarkable amount of skill and polish, resulting from hours of hard work from the students and their teachers.

#### Positive Behaviour Learning

#### What is PBL?

PBL stands for 'Positive Behaviour for Learning'. It is an evidence-based whole school approach to students' well-being and behaviour. This includes teaching students the school expectations and promoting positive behaviour across all school settings.

#### How can you support your child at home?

The whole school focus for this fortnight is around playground behaviour. A picture of the playground expectations is provided here, so you can talk to your children about the expected behaviours when playing at school. This sign can be found displayed in our school.

#### What are gotchas?

In the playground, teachers may reward the expected gumleaf behaviours with gotchas. It is the students' responsibility to take their gotchas to the library and place it into their colour sport house box. Each term all the students from the winning house are rewarded with and end of term sausage sizzle.

#### **Money Collection Procedures** -


