Dear Parents and Caregivers,

It's that time of the year where we celebrate the School Support. This week brings the school community together to celebrate their hard work and the incredible contribution they make to Berowra Public School. Formative Assessment – Focus on Learning

Questioning is a powerful formative assessment tool in the classroom. Strategic questioning enable teachers to stretch thinking, differentiate and gauge understanding.

Specifically, strategic questioning provides teachers with the opportunity to identify and correct misunderstandings and gaps in knowledge, as well as identify the need for extension work for those students whose knowledge and skills base demand it.

This kind of questioning provides information about student knowledge, understanding and skills that informs the teacher's planning and selection of teaching strategies to move students from where they are to where they need to go.

Questions are culture builders linking students, teachers and content together” (Richart, p. 221, 2015). There are five main types of questions:



1. **REVIEW QUESTIONS:**
Ask students to recall previous knowledge or procedures.
2. **PROCEDURAL QUESTIONS:**
Direct classroom activity and behaviour rather than focus on content
3. **GENERATIVE QUESTIONS:**
Sparks inquiry. Two main types' essential questions that direct long term exploration or authentic questions which are content questions to which the teacher doesn't already know the answer.
4. **CONSTRUCTIVE QUESTIONS:**
Advance inquiry. These are questions that ask students to connect ideas, make interpretations, focus on big ideas and central concepts, extend ideas and so on.
5. **FACILITATIVE QUESTIONS:**
Ask students to explain or elaborate thinking.

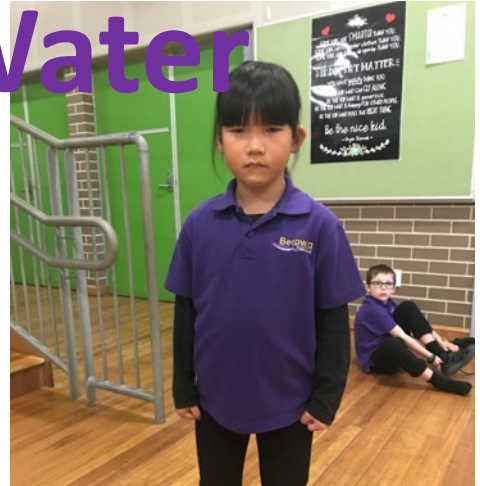

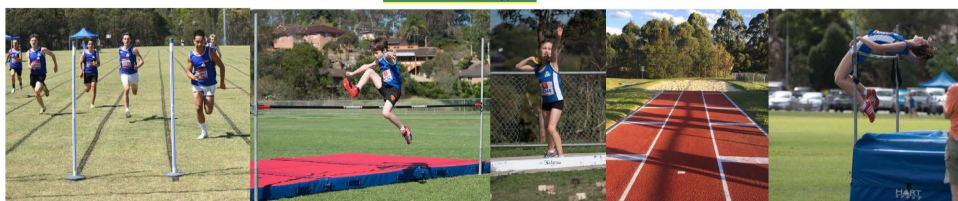
