




Cultures of Thinking

During Week 7 Mrs Beckedahl, Mrs Withford, Mrs Layson and Mrs Walton attended a professional learning course by Simon Brooks on the Cultures of Thinking – (based on Harvard research).

Cultures of Thinking are places where a group's collective as well as individual thinking is valued, visible, and actively promoted as part of the regular, day-to-day experience of all group members. Extensive delays due to manufacturing, wet weather and the impact of heavy trucks and machinery on the playground means that we are still waiting for our shade sail to be installed. I have been reassured that this will proceed as soon as possible so that we do not miss out on our community grant.

I have not received any further information regarding a timeline for replacing our play equipment. This is an AMU managed project and further delays are expected as we are still waiting for 3P and the RFF demountable to be repaired from the storm damage.

Synthetic Turf



Survey Results



The graphs below are a snap shot of the responses and some comments which will help us to make appropriate adjustments.


Are the BPS Parent Communication Procedures clear and easy to understand?

BPS Parent Communication Procedures – Survey Comments

Delayed response and communicating with the teachers

Privacy is a concern

Difficult for parents who work

Good to get a read receipt from the office to acknowledge the email has been received and forwarded to the appropriate person

What to do if your child is sick

It's clear and concise no grey areas

I understand some parents was direct email to teachers but sometimes there needs to be that buffer and teachers can become inundated with unnecessary emails

I see that the new procedures allow teachers to keep a correct record of all communication which is good

BPS Visitor Procedures - Survey Comments

Parents wandering around the playground to collected children from class for early pick up

Adjust access to school grounds drop off and pick up times

BPS Behaviour Management Procedures - Survey Comments






MindQuest 2020




