Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome back for Term 1 2021 and a special welcome to our new students and families starting at BPS this year.

Playground Update

Today the security fence was finally removed from our new playground equipment. Teachers are explicitly teaching all students the rules and expectations for safety on the playground equipment so that we can avoid any injuries.

Please be aware that students are only allowed on the playground equipment while there is a teacher supervising.

The playground equipment is not suitable for students who are not school age.

Class Formation

BPS has received a number of inquiries regarding the formation of classes. This year classes 3-6 are stage based classes and we have one composite 4/5 class. Our class structure is based on the number of students in each grade.

The composition of classes was a whole staff decision and teachers spent a considerable amount of time forming each class in line with the BPS Class Formation and Teacher Allocation Policy.

'Stage-based classes' is a style of classroom organisation with its basis in the educational belief that the individual child is important, learns at his/her own pace and should not have their learning restricted to a confined grade or period of twelve months.

Why Stage Based Classes Work:

- The syllabus documents (by which we teach) are in stages.
- No 'one' group is seen to be disadvantaged all classes in each stage will be given the same opportunities, expectations and strategies.
- A 1997 report Multi-Age Classes in NSW found that these classes based on educational principles do not disadvantage students academically and actually benefit them socially and emotionally.
- Even within the same class, children will be at different levels. Teachers recognise this and differentiate the learning in all classes so that students are accessing the curriculum and learning at their level.
- Research has shown that children become more confident, can operate better as part of a group, are more assertive, become more independent learners and better problem-solvers. They also make friends outside of their standard age-groups, and develop tolerance & diversity.

Attendance

Students should be at school unless:

- they have a medical certificate which states that they are unable to return to school due to an ongoing medical condition and the expected timeframe.
- they are currently unwell.
- In accordance with advice from NSW Health, parents and carers are reminded **NOT** to send children to school if they are unwell, even if they have the mildest flu-like symptoms.
- NSW Health has requested that schools encourage anyone who is unwell or has even mild flu-like symptoms, to arrange to be tested through their local medical practitioner or one of the COVID-19 clinics.
- Students and staff with flu-like symptoms will need to be tested and provide a copy of a negative COVID-19 test result and be symptom-free before being permitted to return to school.

When your child is absent from school, don't forget to send in a note on their return to school to explain their absence. This note should explain the reason for the child's absence, the date(s) of the absence and should be signed and dated by a parent or guardian.


Ensure banking slips are filled out correctly with the Childs Name, Unique Student No, the date and \$ amount being deposited.
