Can you believe we are on the count down to the July holidays already! This term has been jam-packed with teaching, learning, and assessing and reporting. Student reports are in the process of being finalised and will be sent home on Friday of Week 9. Parent teacher interviews and Learning Conversations in 2022 will be held this term in Week 9 and Week 10.

Notes have been sent to parents with details on how to book in a time for parent teacher interviews or Learning Conversations. Please make sure you book in a time before the bookings close on Week 8 Friday 17 June.

This year we have half our classes (Kindy Red, 1K, 1/2A, 3/4G, 5/6B, 5/6C, 5/6G and 5/6H) conducting Learning Conversations instead of parent teacher interviews. The children in these classes will be responsible (with teacher support) for talking about their learning and sharing their learning goals with their parents.

Why Learning Conversations?

The

- Strengthen the connection between home and school.
- Develop a common understanding of your child's learning journey and what they need to learn next.
- Build collective responsibility for student learning and success, which is shared by parents and students.
- Effective partnerships in learning with parents and students mean students are motivated to deliver their best and continually improve.

What our 2021 survey results from Learning Conversations showed us:

- 90% of parents surveyed found Learning Conversations as Positive or Highly Positive.
- 86% of parents surveyed were clear about their child's learning needs
- 89% of parents surveyed were aware of their child's learning goal in reading.
- 89% of parents surveyed were aware of their child's learning goal in writing.
- 95% of parents surveyed were aware of their child's learning goal in numeracy.
- Students value Learning Conversations with comments like this:
- i got to talk about how i felt with my learning
- I got to explain my own learning
- chat about excursion and writing

- That I get to talk to my parents
- I got to talk more and show my learning
- showing book and learning
- like talking about maths
- showing my learning
- i think it is a good idea because it lets the student say where he is going wrong or where he thinks he's excelling
- how i could write about what i thought and say what challenges me or what are my goals
- That you get to show your work to your parents

Students will be working with their teachers and peers to help them prepare for Learning Conversations.

Stage 2 & 3

Students add books they have read by themselves.

To log books on the PRC, students search 'Student Portal' on Google then log in using their regular school DET username and password (please ask your teacher if you are unsure). Click on the second purple tile 'Premier's Reading Challenge'. Students add books they have read to 'Student Reading Records'. You can search for books by typing in the title, click 'Add' to add the book to their reading log.



The PRC closes on 19th August so students have two months to read and add books. K-2 students are required to read (or have read to them) 30 books. Students in Years 3-6 need to read 20 books.

Teacher Learning

Berowra Public School proudly hosted our Instructional Rounds Network on Wednesday and Thursday of Week 7. Mrs Boon, Mr Griffin, Ms Cabral, Mrs Beckedahl and Ms Wallace make up our Instructional Rounds Team. We participated in professional learning over the 2 days with 20 teachers and principals from Oakhill Drive Public School, John Purchase Public School and Thornleigh West Public School. Staff from Denistone East PS were also visiting so they could learn about the Instructional Rounds Process.

Our brave teachers invited the instructional round network into their rooms to conduct observations. The information gathered from the rounds was used to make recommendations for whole school future improvements in teaching and learning. We are extremely proud of our teachers who are motivated to continually learn and implement changes to improve their practice. We are also very proud of all of our students who demonstrated their learning and displayed impeccable manners and behaviour.

Currently our whole school focus is on mathematics. Check out our problem of practice below:

Are we developing students' conceptual understandings and skills in number?

- Do students know what they're learning in number and its importance?
- Do tasks provide opportunities to explore mathematical concepts and language?
- Are we providing opportunities for students to reason, communicate and share their mathematical understanding?







Covid Updates


Staff and students who are close contacts and have no symptoms to continue to attend school if they follow guidelines agreed with NSW Health.





Note that staff and students who have had confirmed COVID-19 in the last 12 weeks, do not have to comply with these guidelines if they become a household or close contact and are not required to self-isolate or test unless they develop new COVID-19 symptoms.

Visitors on school sites

Schools can invite visitors to their sites regardless of their vaccination status, in line with settings in the broader community.

Workers and volunteers must meet double vaccination requirements including:

- volunteers or staff operating uniform shops and canteens
- visitors supporting school operations and curriculum delivery
- allied health partners for the wellbeing of students

• university and TAFE students coming on school sites to complete their practicum or teacher training.

Visitors including volunteers, allied health partners and staff providing professional learning who are close contacts should conduct a daily RAT and return a negative result before attending a school site. They must also wear a mask indoors at all times (except when eating or exercising).

Visitors are also required to advise the school that they are a close contact if they are interacting with students before they come on site.

Notifications for absentees

Thank you to the P&C who has suggested the use of a text-based system for notifying parents their child is absent. We have investigated this and are able to use the Sentral system to do this. Once the office staff is trained we will let you know when we will start trialling the new system. We thank you for your patience while we get this organised.

Early Departures

If your child needs to be collected to leave early, please try to collect them before or after our break times to avoid any unnecessary delays in collection. Our recess time is 11:20-11:45am and our lunch time is 1:30-2:20pm.

Drop-offs and pick-ups

The drop off and pick up of students will continue from Hillcrest Road. To limit contact please ensure you don't linger at drop off or pick up. Teacher supervision in the playground starts at 8:50am, so please ensure students walking to school by themselves are arriving after 8:50am.

Please be reminded that parents should not enter school grounds to drop off or pick up students before or after school.

All parents need to attend the school office during school hours to collect early leavers or deliver late arrivals.

To ease congestion at pick up time children will exit from their allocated stage gates as follows:

Kinder - Hall Cola/Office Gate

Stage 3 - Hall Gate

Stage 1 - BOOSH gate

Stage 2 - Bottom gate near the car park

Students catching a bus or riding a bike will exit from the Hall gate.

Parent Communication

BPS Parent Communication Procedures and our BPS Visitor Procedures are available on our school website.

We encourage parents to engage in their child's learning by leaving a like or a comment on their Seesaw work. If you have questions, enquires or comments for teachers please email or phone the school and the teacher will get back to you as soon as possible.

School Bytes, our school email system is set up to send emails to the parent listed as the 1st contact on student enrolment forms. If you would like to add a second parent/carers contact to receive emails please email your request to the school email address.

Additionally, if you change your email address or are not receiving emails please ensure you notify the school so we can check and update your details.

Intensive cleaning will continue to take place daily and schools are being provided with additional hygiene supplies.

Risk Management Plans

If your child has sustained a serious injury and requires accommodations or adjustments to be put in place please phone the school office to make an appointment with me. We create Risk Management Plans to prevent any further injury and so that all staff are aware of any necessary changes that are put in place.

Enrolments – Please enrol your child now using online enrolments

A child is entitled to enrol at the local school that the student is eligible to attend if his or her home is within that school's intake area.

Currently our school has an enrolment of 347 students. We sit 23 above our enrolment cap of 324 students. An out of area application for BPS can still be made, however, it is submitted to a panel who follow criteria to decide whether the application is accepted.

Learning From Home

Berowra PS is utilising the Department of Education's Learning from Home packages to support students who are at home in isolation due to COVID-19. These resources are available without a school log in - students select their grade level and can be guided through the tasks with a series of videos and explanations. It is advised to start with the KANGAROO package.

Of course, if your child is feeling unwell, there is no expectation that they complete work at home.

Work can be completed offline and returned to the class teacher when your child returns, or via a digital tool such as Google Docs or Slides. A Google Classroom has been established for students in Years 3-6 (Class code is **qq523x4**) where work can be uploaded.

K-2 students are welcome to use this classroom also, but may be less familiar with the technology. Further information about uploading work to Seesaw will be available soon.

If you do not have adequate access to devices, please contact the school to make arrangements for a loan device.

This information will also be sent via School Bytes on notification of a student in isolation.



Attendance

Teachers are still recording attendance. If your child is sick please let the school know by either email or phone so that we can update our rolls accordingly and if they are isolating we are able to provide learning from home.

Students who are learning from home are recorded as Flexible 'F' on the roll. This will not negatively affect their attendance. Teachers will be checking if students have submitted work.

Currently, there are three COVID-19 categories of attendance that will affect the codes used for roll marking.
