Meet the Teacher

We thank the parents and carers who attended our Meet the Teacher afternoon/ evening sessions. It was a positive turn out especially for Stage 1. Information summaries for each stage and Term Overviews have been sent out especially for those who were unable to attend on the night.

Learning Conversations

You will notice on the Term 1 Planner, Learning Conversations with students, teacher and parents are planned for the end of Term 1. This change has been based on the overwhelmingly positive feedback from parents and student about the student led conversations and also parent feedback requesting interviews be held earlier in the year. The learning conversations will replace our traditional parent/teacher interviews which are usually scheduled for the end of Term 2. Students will lead the first 10 minutes of the conversations to talk about their learning especially their learning goals in reading, writing and numeracy. The last

5 minutes of the scheduled time will allow for teachers to meet with parent to have confidential conversations without the students if needed.








5/6M have been learning to locate and describe position on maps and cartesian planes. We have been using compasses, coordinates and positional language.



Starting next week each class in years 1-6 will be shown how to log in to the Premier's Reading Challenge during their library lesson. The students have been shown this week how to find PRC books in our library to borrow. These are books with a sticker on the spine. The K-2 PRC sticker is red, the 3-4 PRC sticker is green and the 5-6 PRC sticker is purple. Below are the instructions for logging in at home. You will not be able to do this until the challenge officially starts but students can start keeping a list of the books they are reading now, to add to their list next week.



To log books on the PRC, students search 'Student Portal' on Google then log in using their regular school DET username and password (please ask your teacher if you are unsure). Click on the second purple tile 'Premier's Reading Challenge'. Students add books they have read to 'Student Reading Records'. You can search for books by typing in the title, click 'Add' to add the book to their reading log.

All parents have access to the Sentral Parent Portal and you can download the app to you phone



You can download, save and print Semester 1 and 2 academic reports

You can check your child's attendance



You can provide reasons for absences without having to send a note or an email



If you know your child will be absent from school on a future date you can provide an explanation in advance



DO WE NEED TEXT MESSAGES TO NOTIFY PARENTS OF STUDENT MAN ABSENCES? MAN

The purpose of the system is to remind parents to provide an explanation for their child's absence

You already know when your child is absent and can provide an explanation via email or on the Sentral parent portal. Do parents need a message to remind them?

High schools often use this system to notify parents that their child is not in attendance at school. Is this a concern for you as a parent?

Each SMS sent costs the school either 10 or 20 cents (based on the number of characters in each message which will vary depending on student names and surnames)

As it is a bulk message system if there is a mistake made in roll marking procedures you may receive a false notification— causing unnecessary anxiety


