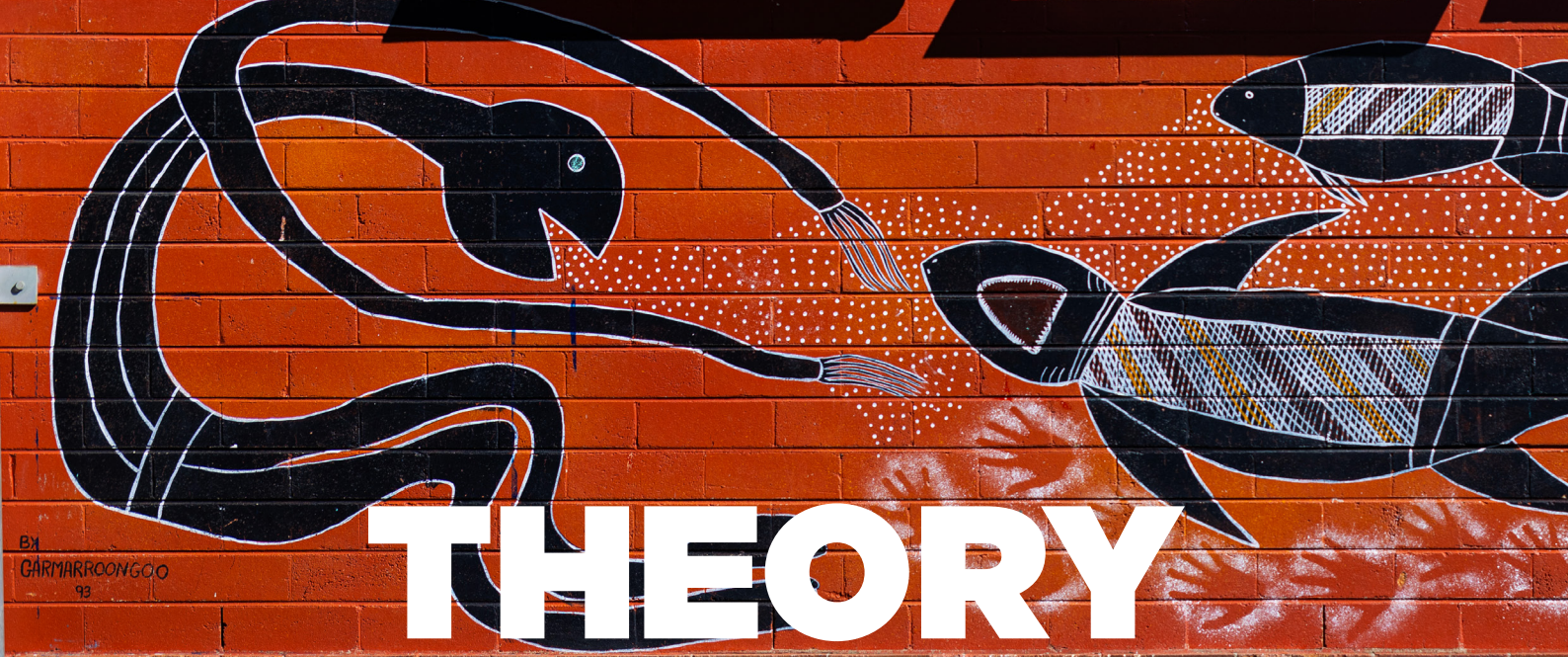
eT4L imaged Mini PC, wireless keyboard and mouse and webcam – either BRIO or MeetUp.

Powerful Learning

This year the BPS Executive Team is a member of the Curiosity and Powerful Learning – School Improvement Program which is facilitated by Professor David Hopkins. As a part of the professional learning process, we revisited our Theory of Action which explains how we are going to bring about change and what we expect will happen. We created a narrative and a visual story about our school and our journey which is informed by our Strategic Improvement Plan. Over time our story will be embedded into the school and will help guide our interactions, plans and practice (A special thanks to Mrs Mitchell for her artistic skills in our visual story). During Week 5 we shared our experience with Instructional Rounds with the rest of the Curiosity and Powerful Learning Network so that other schools can learn from our experiences and the Instructional Rounds process. THEORY OF ACTION

If we continually keep students' needs at the forefront of decision making then we will develop a student centred culture which improves student outcomes.

If we keep the instructional core (teachers, students and task) at the centre of our decision making by ensuring time and effort is focused on what is most important in improving student outcomes then students will be challenged to think deeply and value their learning journey.

If we devote time and resources to sustained professional learning to build teacher capacity then we will develop a reflective learning community and see improvement in teaching and learning through regular observations.

If we build teacher capacity to effectively use ongoing, embedded data driven practice in planning for teaching and learning then we will be responsive to our students' needs and be able to assess the impact on our students.

If we make learning authentic and visible with a clear purpose and trajectory then we will have self-directed students who take responsibility for their own learning through goal setting and reflection.

If we maintain a focus on developing understanding and skill in maintaining wellbeing we will create a positive, adaptive and supportive community environment.

FESTIVAL OF INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC REHEARSAL



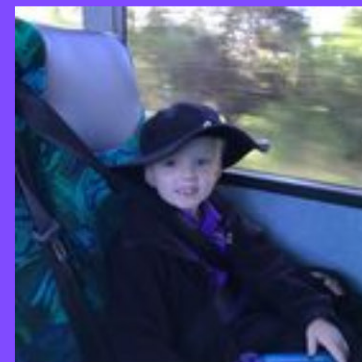

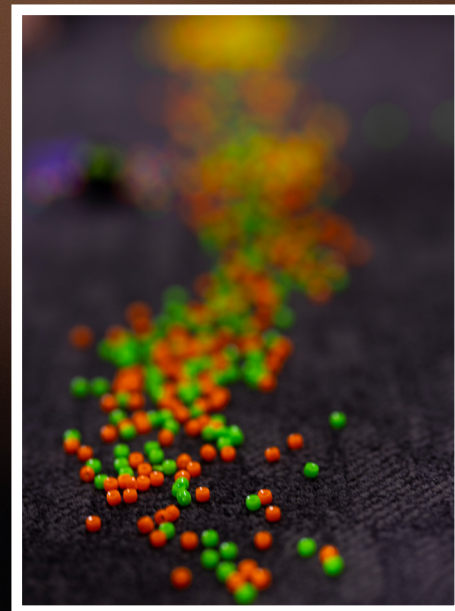

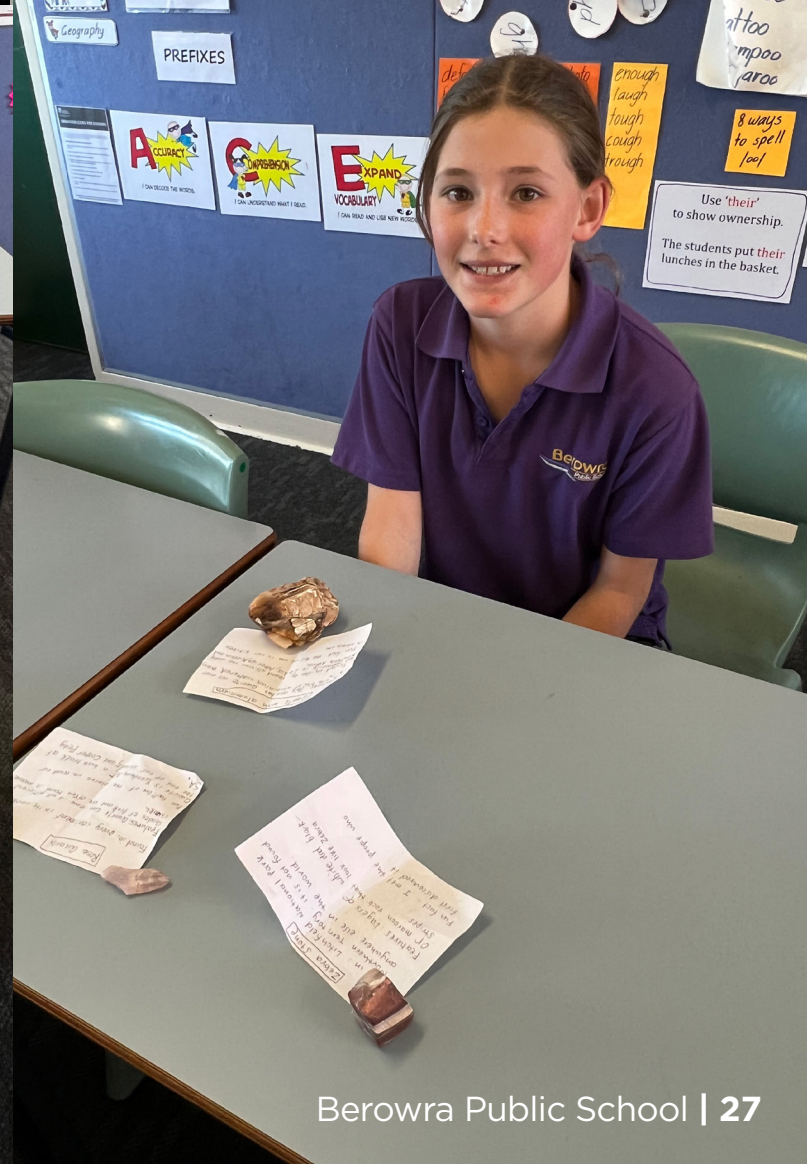




3/4B are learning about Geology.

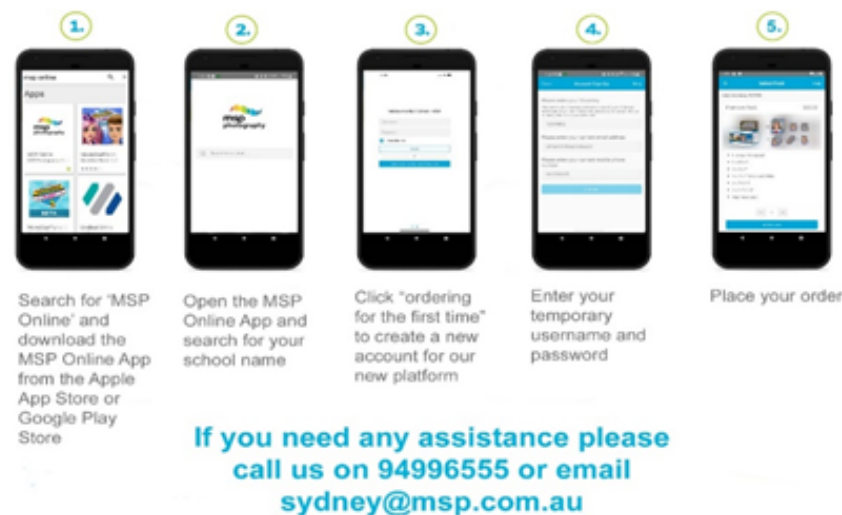

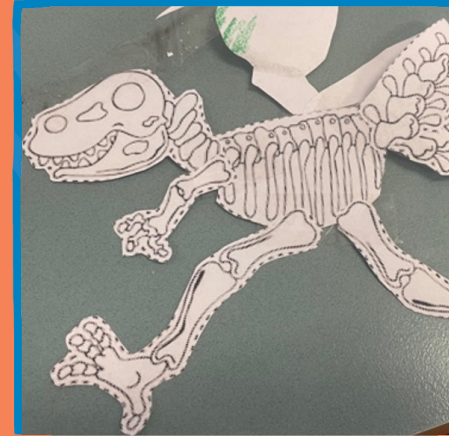

Over the previous fortnight at TheirCare, we embarked on a thrilling journey with our themes "To Infinity and Beyond" and "Dangerous dinosaurs". Our space activities revolved around the wonders of the cosmos and aimed to engage and educate the children in an interactive and imaginative manner. Our dinosaur activities worked to expand our knowledge of these fascinating creatures while promoting creativity, research skills, and physical activity. Some of the highlights of the fortnight included:

-Dinosaur Book Research: We encouraged the children to explore and research information about dinosaurs in our large library collection. This activity promoted literacy skills, research abilities, and critical thinking. They learned to gather information, discern facts from fiction, and expand their knowledge about different dinosaur species.

-Oreo Moon Phases: We delved into the mesmerising world of lunar phases by using everyone's favourite treat, Oreo cookies. The children represented the various stages of the moon's cycle using the cream filling of the cookies. This activity fostered observational skills and helped the children grasp the concept of the moon's waxing and waning phases. Additionally, it enhanced their fine motor skills as they carefully manipulated the cookies.

-Dino Tag: We organised a modified version of the classic Pac-Man game, where children ran along the lines of the basketball court and tried to tag each other. This activity encouraged agility, quick thinking, and spatial awareness. It also provided an opportunity for the children to engage in active play and develop their social skills.

-Straw Air Powered Rockets: Our young space explorers had a blast creating and launching their very own air-powered rockets using straws. This hands-on activity promoted creativity, scientific inquiry, and fine motor skills. The children learned about basic rocket principles and explored concepts such as force, trajectory, and aerodynamics while designing and launching their rockets.
