ver the past few weeks, I have had the pleasure of working with our student leaders to explore student leadership. Please bring your video to school on a thumb drive (clearly labeled with your name and class) and hand it to your teacher or Mr Rutherford in the library.









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





























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

At Home Activities

Savouring food

Sometimes we eat food without really savouring it. For this activity, you get to eat something yummy, and you have to practise really savouring it!. Put a piece of food you like in your mouth and see how long you can last without eating it! Try and notice how it smells, its texture, its size and finally how it tastes. Try and notice something new that you have never noticed about this food before.

Stage 2

Mindful Eating

Mindful eating is something everyone can practise. You can teach your family or friends how to eat mindfully. Tonight, practise eating mindfully and explain to everyone you're eating with how they can join in. Remember, eat slowly, and activate your five senses by noticing the different textures you can feel, the different sounds you make as you eat, what you can see, what you can smell, and of course, what you can taste! After dinner, take a moment to write down what you noticed in your worksheet.

Stage 3

Savouring recipe



For this task, write a set of instructions for someone in your family, or a friend or teacher, to teach them how to savour a special experience. Remember to explain each step clearly so that they can follow each instruction.

WHAT IS THE GAME CHANGER CHALLENGE?

The Game Changer Challenge is the department's award-winning design thinking competition.

Open to public schools across the state the challenge centres on discovering solutions for a real-world, wicked problem by applying classroom learning.



2024 WICKED PROBLEM

Make life better for all without harming the planet.

Your challenge is to invent or innovate solutions that not only spark progress in communities locally and around the world but also ensure our planet stays green and healthy for generations to come.

WHAT DOES THE GAME CHANGER CHALLENGE INVOLVE?

Two teams of 5 students are selected based on their behaviour/participation in STEM lessons and their written application, prepared at school.

Students attend an information session run by the finalists at Asquith Girls High School. Final team selection will be announced before the end of the term. Those who have been selected to be on one of the teams will attend an incursion in term 2 to create the video submission. 120 schools are invited to be apart of the Semi Finals (virtually) and of those, 20 schools are asked to attend the finals in Paramatta.
