






BPS P&C Music Committee

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



















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SCHOOL UNIFORM



In preparation for 2025, we would like to remind families of the correct school uniform for all students. This uniform was designed by Berowra Public School students, promotes a sense of belonging and creates a positive identify for the school community.

Girls Summer Uniform

Purple polo shirt with school logo Completely black Skort/shorts (no logos)

White socks that are below mid calf. Completely black school shoes Black polo fleece jacket Wide brimmed school hat

Girls Winter Uniform

Purple polo shirt with school logo Completely black Skorts, shorts, jazz pants or trousers (no logos) White or black socks Completely black school shoes Black polo fleece jacket Wide brimmed school hat

Boys Summer Uniform

Purple polo shirt with school logo Completely black shorts (no logos) Completely black Shorts or trousers White socks that are below mid calf Completely black school shoes Black polo fleece jacket Wide brimmed school hat



Boys Winter Uniform

Purple polo shirt with school logo (no logos) White or black socks Completely black school shoes Black polo fleece jacket Wide brimmed school hat

Sports Uniform

House colour polo shirt Completely black shorts or skorts (no logos) White socks that are below midcalf and track shoes Wide brimmed school hat

Logos - School logo only on clothing, socks and hats, no other logos should be seen.

Shorts - Shorts must be of an appropriate length. Bike shorts and short shorts are not appropriate for school.

Tights and Leggings - Black tights and/or leggings are only to be worn under school uniform.


Jewellery - Bracelets, necklaces, rings, and earrings (other than studs or small sleepers) are not permitted to be worn at school. Watches can be worn and in the case of Smart Watches, must be on 'school mode', as per the BPS mobile phone procedure.

Make Up - Make up is not permitted to be worn at school unless necessary for school performances.

Accessories - Nail polish or false nails are not permitted to be worn at school. Hair that touches the shoulder must be pulled back. Small hair accessories are permitted in the school colours of purple, yellow and black.

Please label all student belongings clearly and check the labels regularly.

At Home Activities

Go me!

Things don't always go the way you want, but you can practise resilience by learning to 'bounce back'. For this task, draw a picture of yourself overcoming a real or imaginary challenge.

Stage 2

Resilience Pie

Draw a circle and split it into five sections with the following labels: 1. Family/people that care for me, 2. Friends that I can go to, 3. Artistic things I can do, 4. Physical things I can do, 5. Kind words I can say to myself.

Then fill in each section to identify different ways that you can manage challenges in life. Remember you can always come back to your resilience pie to remember the different things you can do to bounce back.

Stage 3The Importance of Resilience

Resilient people look for new ways of thinking and acting to make themselves strong and overcome challenges. They find new strategies to deal with upsets and problems. This week, interview 3 people about why they think resilience is important and what strategies they use to overcome setbacks. You can interview your friends or teachers at school or your family members at home. Write down what they say on your worksheet.
