Your child's report will still show their progress across all subject areas. Teacher comments will appear in English, mathematics and the general comment section, in line with department

policy*. The general comment for Kindergarten also covers all other key learning areas including, creative arts, HSIE, PDHPE, and science and technology. A new achievement scale and descriptions are included to provide a clearer picture of your child's progress. We welcome your feedback or questions about the new report format.






GARDEN CLUB




5/6A: DESIGNING A FAIR FROM SCRATCH

My class have been working hard this term in all our Key Learning Areas. In Mathematics we have been working on using flexible addition and subtraction strategies. Our unit of work culminated in the students designing and organising a local fair that runs for 2 weeks during the school holidays. They needed to think about the types of rides and activities they would have as well as the facilities they needed such as toilets, cafes and so on. The ongoing costs were also important, such as paying staff and the cost of advertising.

In Science students have been studying Earth and Space and 5/6A enjoyed making their smores in the solar ovens they made and learning more about the power of the sun. Of course, their favourite part was eating the smores!





STAGE 2 EXCURSION

COASTAL ENVIRONMENT FIELD TRIP

Stage 2 attended their science excursion yesterday to Long Reef Headland. The students studied the effects of erosion on the coastline environment by conducting experiments and then witnessing first hand the effects of erosion on Long Reef Beach which led to the building of the sea wall in 2016.

Students used a range of equipment to measure weather patterns as well as create timelines of weather events from the past.

Walking along the rock platforms was definitely the highlight as we searched for and identified a range of aquatic animals. Students found such a variety of sea creatures, ensuring of course that their habitats were preserved.

Stage 2 teachers were proud of the way our students behaved and engaged in the learning opportunity and a great day was had by all.









This fortnight's Smiling Mind focus is **Movement**

At Home Activities

K-2

Star jumps

This activity prompts you to connect your brain and body to the present moment. Do star jumps for 1 minute and then stop and focus on your heartbeat. It might help to put your hand over your heart to feel your heartbeat. Take some slow, deep breaths and feel your heartbeat slow down. Have you ever felt your heartbeat slowing down like this before? How did it make you feel?

Stage 2

Balancing on one foot

Mindful movement helps us to connect our brains and our bodies. This isn't always easy to do! For this activity, try to balance on one foot for as long as you can and then afterwards describe how different parts of your body feel. Did you feel any tingly sensations in your foot? Could you feel a tickling in your legs? How did it feel to concentrate on just balancing and nothing else? Was it easy or hard to do?

Stage 3

Walking with my Body

Mindful movement is a great way to practise mindfulness and to tune into the sensations of your body. For this activity, go for a walk but slow down and notice what walking really feels like. Feel your feet touching the ground, the muscles in your legs contracting with each step, the swaying of your arms, the air against your cheeks. Reflect on your experience by writing about it. How did it feel to slow down and focus on your body? Did any sensations or thoughts come up as you did this practice? Did you feel more connected to your body?

A DAY AT BOBBIN HEAD

Last Wednesday, the School Captains, Vice Captains, Prefects, House Captains, Prime Minister and the Secretary all went on a leadership excursion to Bobbin Head.

The leadership excursion focused on teamwork and helping each other throughout the day. Some of the activities for the first group emphasised teamwork. The first game involved moving on a plank as a team; everyone had to hold a rope and walk together. It was hard at first, but it got easier as a team. The second game used mats, and at least one teammate had to be touching a mat while moving to the finish line. My team excelled at the mat game. The third game was like a marble run, where you had to use five marble run pieces to reach the end without the marble touching the ground or your hand. The last game with group one was a sponge fight. The sponges were in the middle, and you had to use the mats to retrieve them, then throw them.

With group two, we went kayaking and used one canoe. We paddled down the river to find a shallow spot for splashing in the water and raced each other on the way back.

For the last activity, we went on a bushwalk as a group. During the bushwalk, we found a sleeping possum in a tree. We also had a map with numbered locations where we had to stop and answer questions. We discovered some Aboriginal stone sharpening groove. At the end of the trail, there was a little creek where we sat silently for ten minutes before returning to the home area to go home.

Completely black school shoes
Black polo fleece jacket
Wide brimmed school hat

Girls Winter Uniform

Purple polo shirt with school logo
Completely black Skorts, shorts, jazz pants or trousers (no logos)
White or black socks
Completely black school shoes
Black polo fleece jacket
Wide brimmed school hat

Boys Summer Uniform

Purple polo shirt with school logo
Completely black shorts (no logos)
White socks that are below mid calf
Completely black school shoes
Black polo fleece jacket
Wide brimmed school hat

Boys Winter Uniform

Purple polo shirt with school logo
Completely black Shorts or trousers (no logos)
White or black socks
Completely black school shoes
Black polo fleece jacket
Wide brimmed school hat

Sports Uniform

House colour polo shirt
Completely black shorts or skorts (no logos)
White socks that are below mid-calf and track shoes
Wide brimmed school hat



Logos - School logo only on clothing, socks and hats, no other logos should be seen.

Shorts – Shorts must be of an appropriate length. Bike shorts and short shorts are not appropriate for school.



Tights and Leggings – Black tights and/or leggings are only to be worn under school uniform.

Jewellery – Bracelets, necklaces, rings, and earrings (other than studs or small sleepers) are not permitted to be worn at school. Watches can be worn and in the case of Smart Watches, must be on 'school mode', as per the BPS mobile phone procedure.

Make-Up – Make-up is not permitted to be worn at school unless necessary for school performances.

Accessories – Nail polish or false nails are not permitted to be worn at school. Hair that touches the shoulder must be pulled back. Small hair accessories are permitted in the school colours of purple, yellow and black.

Please label all student belongings clearly and check the labels regularly.

Student Login Instructions

1 If you are signing in from the [Student Experience site](#) click the "Log in" button in the top right hand corner

2 If you are signing in from the PRC main site, click on the "Log in" button

3 Enter your DoE ID username and password

4 If this is your first time logging into the PRC website on a device, you'll be asked if you trust this website.

Public school students will see their DoE email address
Non-government and homeschooled students will see their DoE ID alongside a placeholder email address.

Click "Continue"

5 If this is your personal device, tick the box and click "Yes". This will save your username and password in your browser's cache so you don't have to enter your details next time.

If this is a shared device, click "No". Your username and password will not be saved.

6 Once you have successfully logged in, an avatar will appear in the top right hand corner.

1 We recommend always checking if every book you have read is a PRC title before entering it as a choice book, as new books are added to the PRC booklists in Terms 1, 2 and 3.

7 Enter the title of the book and/or the author's name in the blue box and click **Search**.

8 If the correct title appears, click **Add to Reading Log**

9 The book will now appear in your reading log. To view your reading log, click the avatar icon:

10 Click "My Reading Log"

1 If a book doesn't appear in the blue search bar, you can add it as a Choice book

1. The Challenge opens on Monday 24 February 2025 to NSW students in Years K-10. You must complete your online Student Reading Record by Friday 22 August 2025 (11:59 pm) to complete the Challenge.

2. You must read a certain number of books to complete the Challenge. Please refer to the [Booklists](#) page for more information.
